MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

Motion to Approve by Pete Johnson, second by Dick Harris. Unanimous Vote.

DISCUSSION

1) Chairman Schnierlein gave an update on Per and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS). He explained what the State of CT is doing to address PFAS. Governor Ned Lamont established the Connecticut Interagency PFAS Task Force on July 8, 2019 which is led by the Department of Public Health and the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and contains representatives from a broad variety of State Agencies and is tasked with delivering a PFAS action plan. 2. 2) Chairman Schnierlein talked about the Norwalk River Watershed Initiative and how a meeting of the representatives from the watershed towns and the State and Federal agencies can be convened to re-establish the initiative. Chris Malik discussed initiative with Alexis Cherichetti, Senior Environmental Officer, and planned a meeting for December 5, 2019 @ 3:00pm at Wilton Town Hall. Items discussed were purpose, interest, funding, frequency of meetings, sustainability, membership, prioritizing the plan and a convenient time to meet.
3. 3) Chairman Schnierlein shared a letter he is proposing to the Mayor and Common Council regarding concern of the availability of water for the increase in population under normal conditions as well as drought conditions and he believes the water providers should be consulted as to their ability to provide water. Members of the Committee will review the letter and make comments to be discussed at the next meeting.
