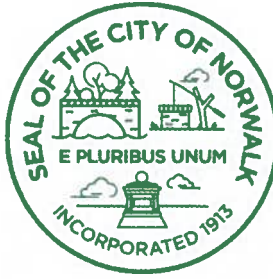

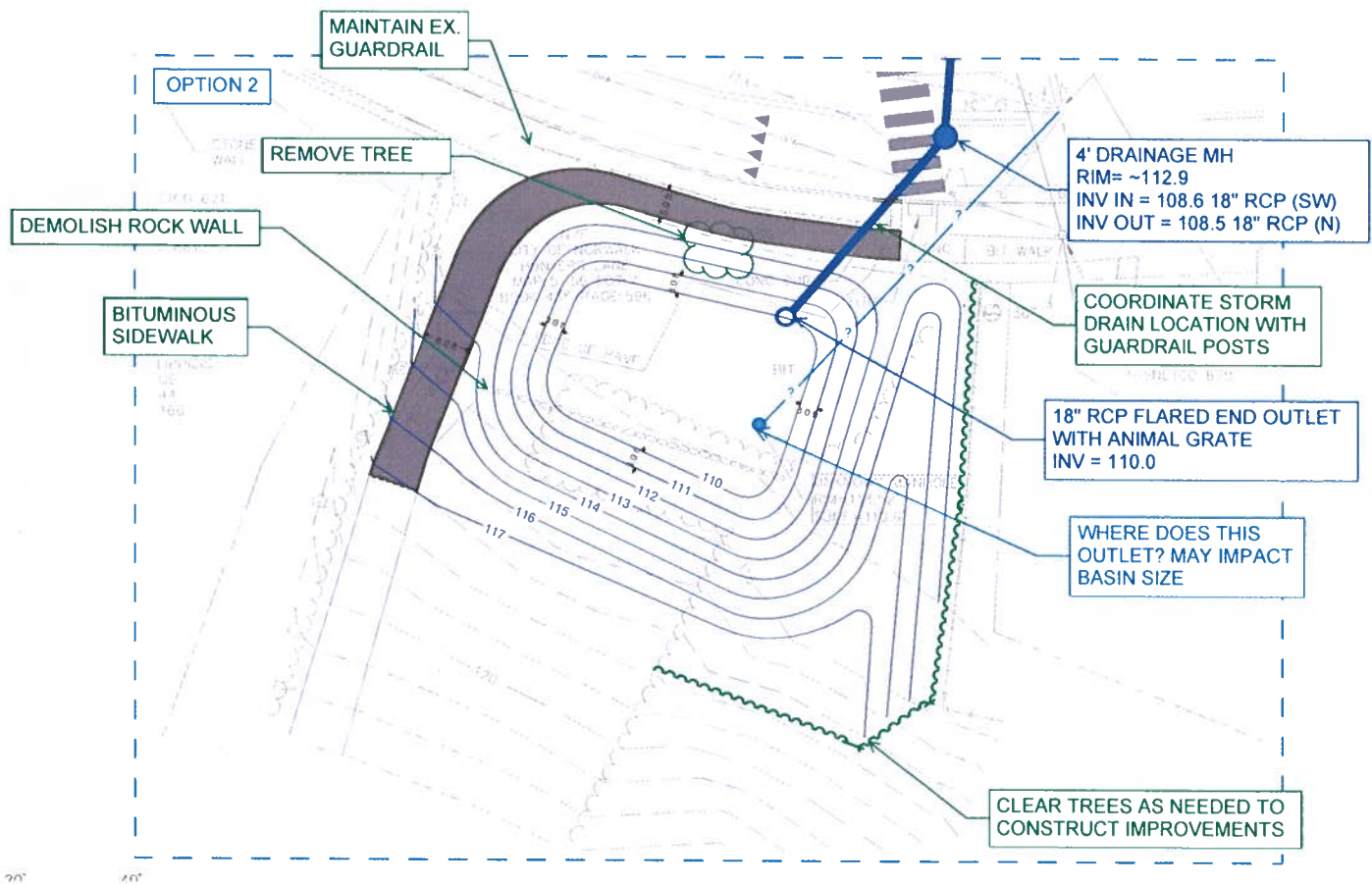

As part of Project DRG2023-3 On-Call Drainage, the City of Norwalk is proposing drainage improvements that include the installation of a detention basin on the property of Ponus Middle School, located at 21 Hunters Lane, Norwalk, CT. The proposed detention basin will be constructed along the side of the property adjacent to Ponus Avenue.

The installation of the proposed detention basin is a critical component of the drainage improvements in this area. The basin is designed to attenuate stormwater runoff from the parcel, increase the time of concentration prior to discharge into the downstream storm drainage system, and provide water quality improvements through the temporary storage and controlled release of stormwater. These improvements will reduce peak flows entering the existing storm system and improve the overall performance of the drainage infrastructure serving the surrounding area.

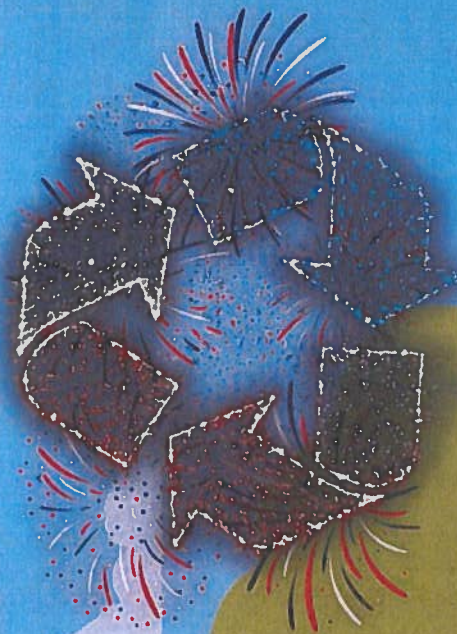

Department of Engineering – Public Works Committee Meeting – August 4, 2026

Current Construction:

RD2025-2 – Sidewalks, Drainage and Paving on Flax Hill Rd from Arbor Dr to Washington St

This project consists of the installation of new concrete curbs, sidewalks, and roadway paving on Flax Hill Road from Arbor Drive to Washington Street. This is a joint project in conjunction with the South Norwalk Electric and Water Co (SNEW).

- The contractor, Guerrera Construction has completed all construction related to SNEW work.
- Sidewalk work is underway and is substantially complete. Roadway milling and paving is underway.

Project No: RD2026-1 - Roadway Paving and Sidewalk Installation for Roton Avenue and Pine Point Road (From McKinley Street to Nearwater Road)

This project consists of the installation of new concrete curbs, sidewalks, and roadway paving on Roton Avenue and Pine Point Road from McKinley Street to Nearwater Road.

- The contractor, Burns Construction has just completed construction of the new sidewalk, drainage structures and roadway paving from Nearwater Road up to Crockett Street. Roadway has been reclaimed for grading purposes.
- The SNEW contractor, Penna has just completed work in the area.
- Burns has begun construction work between Crockett Street and McKinley Street.
- Full completion is anticipated in August apart from any unforeseen challenges.

PM2025-2 - Paving at Various Locations

This project consists of milling, reclaiming, and paving of Witch Lane (Highland to Wilson), and surrounding side streets (Old Witch Court, Old Field Road, Tory Hill Lane),

- Construction is complete. This includes including roadway paving, extruded concrete curb, and asphalt sidewalks.
- It also consists of new sidewalk and pedestrian ramps on Grumman Avenue at the intersection of Newtown Avenue.

Project No: PM2026-1 - Roadway Paving and Sidewalk Installation for Fillow Street (From Grandview to North Taylor)

- B&W Paving & Landscaping is the contractor.
- Construction began the week of June 22.
- Milling is complete from Van Ness St. to North Taylor Ave. Paving is underway in the area.
- Concrete work is being performed in vicinity of Kendall school.

Project BR2026-1 - Bridge 102-025 and Bridge 102-029 - Bonnybrook Trail over Holy Ghost Fathers Brook

- This project consists of the repair of the existing stone masonry headwalls and wingwalls, installation of riprap topped with natural streambed material in the inlet and discharge areas, as well as the removal and replacement of the existing guiderail system on the north and south sides of the bridge with a steel-backed timber guiderail system.
- Project is substantially complete
- The contractor, Yield Industries is currently installing the steel-backed timber guiderail system.

Project BR2024-2 - Replacement of the West Cedar Street Bridge over the Five Mile River

- Project is substantially complete.
- The contractor, Dayton Construction is currently performing punch list items in the area

Design:

Lockwood Lane Roadway Paving and Sidewalk:

This project consists of the installation of new concrete curbs, sidewalks, and roadway paving on Lockwood Lane. This is following a recently completed drainage project in the area.

- We will hold off construction of Lockwood Lane until TMP's George Ave sidewalk project takes place

Drainage Study for Intersection of Meadow St and South Main St

Our consultant, Langan Engineers have been retained to design a stormwater remediation system for the intersection of Meadow Street and South Main Street. This is the location of the proposed roundabout from TMP for the new school.

- Although originally planned as a single project with TMP's roundabout project, we are looking to implement this at an earlier date.
- The project is in design and will need to be submitted to CTDOT for permit approval.

Glendenning Street and Cannon Street Area Stormwater Remediation

Our consultant, Woodard & Curran is currently designing a major stormwater system from Glendenning Street to the bridge at Cannon Street. 90% drawings are being reviewed.

- We have obtained all relevant federal and state permits and are waiting for final approval from the City of Norwalk Conservation Commission.
- We are coordinating with utility relocations and easements.
- We are hopeful to begin construction should begin July, 2026.

New Canaan Ave/Ponus Ave Storm Drainage Improvements – Phases 1 and 2

Our consultant, Woodard & Curran is currently designing a major stormwater system at Ponus Avenue near Broad River Park. This will involve a major drainage renovation between the Broad River Park baseball field and the existing storm outfall on Nutmeg Place.

- Design is in the early stages and we are hopeful to advertise in summer 2026 with construction beginning in Fall 2026. However, this will depend on the approval of all relevant federal and state permits.
- This project would be the first in a multi-phase capital project designated to alleviate flooding in the Ponus Ave area as far as Fox Run Road.

Current Projects out to bid/bid received:

Roadway Paving and Sidewalk for Heather Lane, Cory Lane, Byselle Road, and Beacon Street:

This project consists of the installation of new concrete curbs, sidewalks, and roadway paving on Heather Lane, Cory Lane, Katy Lane, and Byselle Road.

- The project is currently advertised this for construction.
- Paving on Beacon Street will be included as an alternate bid on this project. The actual construction of Beacon will take place in Spring 2027 but will depend on the completion of the current sanitary sewer project.

PM2026-2 - Roadway Paving of West Ave (Maple St To I-95n) and Maple St (West Ave to U.S. Route 1)

- We have received bids for the project on Tuesday, June 30. Grasso Companies, LLC is the low bidder.

BR2026-1 - Bonnybrook Trail Rehabilitation Project For Bridge No. 102-025 And 102-029

The project is a bridge rehabilitation/preservation project at two (2) proposed Bridge Sites/Locations on Bonnybrook Trail, Bridge No. 102-025- Bonnybrook Trail Over Holy Ghost Fathers Brook And Bridge No. 102-029 - Bonnybrook Trail Over Holy Ghost Fathers Brook.

- Bids were recently opened and Yield Industries, LLC is the low bidder.
- Construction has begun and will continue to the end of July.
- There is a lead time for steel backed timber guiderail of eight weeks. Once they obtain the guiderail, installation will take approximately two weeks.

Project No: BLDG2026-1 - Installation of handicap ramps in the parking lot area at City Hall

- This is an ADA Coordinator project is to install several new handicap ramps at city hall.
- Bids were recently opened and A. Vitti Excavating is the low bidder.
- We are awaiting an executed contract.
