EPIDEMIOLOGY UPDATES

Mr. Weeks greeted everyone and displayed the CDC Respiratory Illness Activity page. He noted that the nation was in the moderate category. In CT, the wastewater indicators indicate that CT is high. The nation is in the uptick phase for most of the East Coast for both the flu and RSV. He reviewed the details of Norovirus, rhinovirus and enterovirus. He reminded everyone to wash their hands during this holiday season.

VAPE SHOP ORDINANCE.

Ms. D'Amore then spoke about smoke and vape shops selling illegal cannabis. The Ordinance Committee of the Common Council is looking to establish and have drafted an ordinance to address these concerns. She said that the Common Council will be considering the health department to license and enforce violations for vape and smoke shops. Ms. D'Amore said that she had concerns about the Health Department being responsible for licensing these establishments since the Health Department's focus should be encouraging people not to smoke or vape. She also has some questions about staff safety when doing these inspections. The focus of the Health Department is on prevention.

Dr. Ehrlich said he felt that having the Health Department as the enforcement entity would be a mistake. He pointed out that the Health Department is opposed to vaping and asked how they could approve a store that sells vaping products.

Mr. Santella agreed and asked if the Health Department had the staffing to handle this. Dr. Weinberger and Mr. Lalime agreed.

Ms. McNeil pointed out there were licensed cannabis shops in Norwalk and felt that the agency that licenses these establishments should license the smoke and vape shops.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. D'Amore welcomed Mr. Santella to the Board. She then spoke about the Operating Budget and gave a brief overview of changes in the State statutes. Lastly, she gave an update on statewide efforts for Medicaid redesign.

ADJOURNMENT

Ms. D'Amore wished everyone happy holidays and said that she was looking forward to working with everyone in 2025. She adjourned the meeting at 8:25 a.m.
