c) #RA09-03 – 17 Broad Street – FinishMaster, LLC - Registration Application for active facility (D.B.A. FinishMaster) within the APA – Further review & decision

d) #RA09-04 – 30 Muller Avenue (aka Muller Industrial Park) – Hutchinson Tree Care Specialists Inc. - Registration Application for active facility within the APA – Further review & decision

Ms. Cherichetti explained that the late fee for the registrations was \$200 per day. The Agency discussed the matter of how exactly the late fees should be enforced. Ms. Cherichetti also noted that there is a "corrective action" registration fee. Ms. Light stated concern about how the late fees could discourage compliance.
