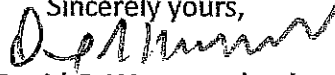

As you have appointed me to the Norwalk Redevelopment Agency Commission, please accept my resignation from the Historical Commission, effective immediately.

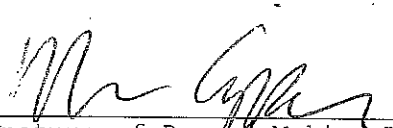

The City of Norwalk accepted bids on June 15, 2018 for the CTDOT Project 102-320 - Rehabilitation of Bridge No. 04989 - James Street Bridge over the Silvermine River. Five firms responded to the City/State Request for Bids, with the low bidder being NJR Construction LLC., with a low bid of \$1,818,366.89. This project is 80% funded by the Federal Local Bridge Program at 80% reimbursement and City share at 20% for participating items of work.

Due to not having received authorization from ConnDOT to advertise for bids until the second week of May and following the requirement that the project needed to be advertised for a minimum of 21 days, bids were delayed and were not available at the time of the DPW Committee meeting held on June 05, 2018. We received four responses to an RFP for promotional tests. The prices ranged from \$33,000 to \$71,950. Our preferred vendor was Badgequest as they have conducted our last two promotional tests and we have been extremely happy with them. They were also the low bidder as well.

We have an opening for lieutenant with the promotion of Lt Walsh to Deputy Chief to replace Deputy Chief Gonzalez who retired. As a result we will need to test to fill that position, and then the subsequent openings for those who get promoted. We have the funds reserved in the account to cover it.

The specific action that is requested is:

Authorize the Mayor, Harry W. Rilling, to execute an agreement with Badgequest, Inc., to conduct promotional testing for the ranks of Detective, Sergeant and Lieutenant, for a sum not to exceed \$33,000 from account 013049-5258.
